

POLICY AT CONVENTION SESSIONS

It will be the primary objective of the Chairman to help expedite the business which must be covered at this Convention. In doing so, if the Chair at times appears to be arbitrary, he begs the indulgence of the Delegates.

Business of this Convention will be conducted according to the Constitution and By-Laws of the F.O.C.A., supplemented by Robert's Rules of Order as revised.

However, it must be remembered that, " ... the great purpose of rules and regulations is to serve the will of an Assembly rather than restrain it; to facilitate and not to obstruct the expression of delegates ... " Rules are designed to protect the minority and need not be enforced when there is minority to protect.

Accordingly, the Chair wishes it to be known that it stands ready at anytime to assist delegates in the explanation of motions, advise them on points of information and, if necessary, to help in the phrasing of motions. Any Delegate should feel free to express him/herself on any subject and to offer motions on same regardless of his or her lack of knowledge of parliamentary procedure. Parliamentary procedure, as such, will not be used to obstruct any business of this Convention.

A standing rule permits Alternates to be seated with Delegates on the Convention floor and permits them expression of opinion subject to recognition by the Chair, although only the Delegate (or Alternate acting as a Delegate) is permitted to vote.

We will adhere to the Agenda as outlined, and if it becomes necessary, in the opinion of the Chair, to limit debate and number of speakers, it will do so.

The Chair, in exercising its authority, will attempt to;

- 1. Assist is expediting business.
- 2. Restrain members when engaged in debate.
- 3. Enforce observance of decorum and order.
- 4. Inform Delegates on points of order.
- 5. Confine debates to questions and not personalities.
- 6. Prevent object of meeting to be defeated by persons using parliamentary form which results in the obstruction of business.

Every Delegate present is entitled to be heard and to make motions. The Chair will help whenever called upon to do so. While this is absolutely true, Delegates must refrain from monopolizing the floor and from speaking more than twice on the same subject.

Do not be overly concerned with "Parliamentary Procedure". All rules and regulations will be applied to help rather than hinder the conduct of business.

The Chair will try to be as informal as possible and make sure that everyone has a chance to be heard and have their feeling made known.

Who are we and what do we want to be? That is a very difficult question to answer or is it? We can't deny that society has changed in the last few years. People have gotten into patterns of being alone, not needing to do "what they used to do" and adjusted their lives to be void of participation. We see this within the educational system, the business world and yes even in our parishes. Just because this is happening doesn't make it right. Yes those of us still holding the reins are tired but it is at this point we need to look inside ourselves and say we are working for a great good.

Sometimes we need to stop looking to reinvent ourselves and just do the things we are good at doing. Do we need to be a large organization to do good work? Are we measured by the number of people who pay to be members or by the amazing acts of charity that we do each and every year?

Our organization is very good at coming together and assisting Orthodox Christians in need. From children in Alaska, Seminarian families at Christmas, Orthodox charitable organizations in need, chaplains, Orthodox school children in Africa... the list goes on and on. Why do we do this? Because as Orthodox Christians we are called to serve others. We need to stop complaining that our numbers are low or "not what they used to be". You can ask any secular organization and they will say the same thing but they continue to carry on. Why? Because they know they serve a greater purpose than counting members.

We need to focus on what we do best and move forward. What are we good at? Helping others in need, religious education, bringing Orthodox Christians together in worship and fellowship. Do we need to be anything else? In my humble opinion no. We have existed for 96 years for a reason and that reason is listed above. If the fact that the organization has reduced in size truly bothers you then that is a good thing. That means that you care, we just have to find the tenacity to move past the negative feelings and conversations because all that does is create even more discontent. We need to plan activities that promote our mission statement. "

In the last few months I have attended events in several different parishes and venues that bring Orthodox Christians together. Whether it be a funeral, a youth retreat, a parish fellowship night or a fundraiser for an Orthodox charity; one theme is constant. Many of the people attending did not really want to go; they were either brought there by a family member, purchased a ticket out of guilt or just didn't feel like getting out of their comforts of home and going somewhere. Once at the event, we see friends from the past, feel the comforts of familiar faces and surroundings; we start to remember why we "used to do" these things and at the end of the night, feel really good to have gone. What does it take? It takes a few brave people to get out and ask someone to go, join them and make them feel comfortable.

I implore those of you reading this to be that brave person to go out and invite someone to that event, make them feel comfortable, feel like they belong. This is how we move forward into the next chapter of our organization.

Ok great so we have a few events but what about our districts, chapters and members? Well do we really need to be so defined? Or do we just need a communication system in place that lets members know what is happening in their local areas, dioceses or around the country? What if you have an existing active chapter? Keep doing what you do best; use our national communication vehicle to let others in the area know what's happening and invite them to attend. Not in an area where there is a chapter? You can stay involved with charitable activitiesget your local parish involved to raise awareness for the needs of other Orthodox Christians.

Does our organization need to make a change? Absolutely! Do we need to fold up and go home? No. Do we still provide support and fellowship for Orthodox Christians in the United States and around the world? Of course. We need to just do what we do best and keep moving forward. Archbishop Michael tells us to keep telling our story and doing good works. People will see the good and want to be a part of your group.

Finally I will leave you with this "The past is your lesson, the present is your gift. The future is your motivation" Anonymous.

I encourage you to openly discuss the future activities of our organization, to continue the good works of our Fellowship and actively contribute to our 100th anniversary celebration!

Let's find our motivation through our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

Recommendations:

- A committee be formed to create a new scholarship rubric to increase the focus on service to the Church and community. The rubric created will be ready to use for the 2024 scholarship judging criteria.
- 2. Our current district boundaries need to be revised. Active chapters should be placed within 2 large geographic areas. These chapters can communicate through various types of media. One major gathering a year should be planned for members to come together.
- 3. A women's retreat will be held in the fall (East Coast) and Spring (Midwest). The planning committee will decide on the date and location.

- 4. A family weekend will be held in Philadelphia, January 12-14 in conjunction with the Novogodny Ball.
- 5. The FOCA to partner with The Surasl organization in the following ways:
 - a. Organize a group of young adults to attend a world-wide gathering of Orthodox Youth in Suprasl, Poland in the Summer of 2024.
 - b. Host a training session for young adults who wish to become future leaders in their Orthodox Church

For those FOCA members who have been attending National Conventions over the past twenty or thirty years, you would agree that the annual convention book reports submitted by Walter Alesevich for the Colonial District were among the most thorough reports appearing in the report book. Most of you know that Walter retired from his career with the US Postal Service at the end of 2022 and has relocated to Connecticut. On behalf of the members of the Colonial District, thank you, Walter, for your years of service and dedication to the Fellowship and to the Colonial District. This is my first National Convention report and I will try to live up to Walter's high standards and use the same format he used.

RELIGIOUS/EDUCATIONAL

The Colonial District has not held a Religious Education Day in several years, in spite of chapters being on a rotation schedule which specifies when chapters are responsible for hosting events. The chapters do, however, support the annual Gifts of Love appeal. The annual Seminarian Wish List Project – one of the best FOCA programs that Allison Steffaro coordinates every November – is supported by the district chapters. 2022 was the 17th consecutive year Chapter #82 sponsored a seminarian at St. Tikhon's Seminary and a seminarian at St. Vladimir's Seminary, and also sent Wal-Mart gift cards to St Herman's Seminary.

COLONIAL DISTRICT – (Cont'd)

As a District project, each year a seminarian from either St. Tikhon's or St. Vladimir's receives a monthly check for \$100 for the 9-month school year. The recipient is recommended in coordination with the seminary dean and the District Spiritual Advisor. At the District Convention in October 2022, that check was increased to \$150 per month. The project is funded by contributions from each of the District chapters.

ATHLETIC

The last Colonial District Bowling Tournament was sponsored by Chapter #78 in February 2020 before COVID-19 turned the world on its ear. The tournament chairman was Paul Kavchok. Memory Eternal!

JUNIORS

At the 2022 National Convention in Baltimore, held in conjunction with the OCA All-American Council, the Colonial District reported a small Junior OCF chapter at the parish in Columbia, MD, a parish which doesn't have a Senior Chapter. The current status of the chapter is unknown. In the Colonial District annual budget, there is a provision for a small (\$350) District scholarship award, but there haven't been any Junior applicants for the past two years.

SOCIAL

For more than 80 years (the Alpha "R" Club for the first 50 years and St. Stephen's OCF for the last 35 years), these chapters have been welcoming our FROC/FOCA friends to the Philadelphia area to ring in the New Year at the Novogodny Ball. This has evolved into a quasi-national FOCA event that attracts members from six states and often includes members of the FOCA Executive Board. The ballroom was dark in January 2021 and 2022 due to COVID, but January 2023 saw nearly 200 patrons enjoying this outstanding event. St. Stephen's is looking forward to hosting our FOCA friends again in January 2024 on the Sunday evening prior to the Martin Luther King holiday.

FINANCES

The district has managed to stay solvent and able to function primarily due to proceeds from the annual Stock Awards drawing each June. The District Convention generates very little revenue for the district and there hasn't been a District Bowling Tournament since 2020.

MEMBERSHIP

In 1976, the 50th anniversary of the FROC, the Colonial District contained ten active senior chapters with an aggregate membership of 246 members. St. Michael's in Philadelphia reported 59 members. That chapter no longer exists. In 1993, Nation's Capital "R" Club reported 62 members. That chapter is inactive. In 2017, St. Mark chapter in Bethesda reported 56 members. That chapter is inactive. My best guess is that the entire Colonial District membership will be less than 50 members as of the date of this convention. The numbers are sobering, but they don't lie. (And will someone please explain "Independent Chapters" to me!). And exactly what do I get in return for my annual membership dues?

DISTRICT CONVENTION

In accordance with the rotation schedule, the next Colonial District Convention will be held in Baltimore on the first Saturday in October. This is dependent, however, on any action this Convention body takes with respect to the future of the District.

THE COLONIAL DISTRICT - WHERE DO WE GO FROM HERE?

When I was growing up in Central Pennsylvania back in the 1960's, I had heard about this wonderful organization called the FROC. When I graduated from college in 1970 and relocated to Philadelphia, I started a chapter at St. Nicholas parish in Northern Liberties and attended my first National Convention in Washington, DC in 1972. 51 years later, the FOCA is a shadow of its former self. The hotly debated name change in the late 1970's didn't have the hoped for boost to membership. The frequently discussed recognition by the OCA always seemed to be out of reach. Refer to the Report of the

Exploratory FROC/OCA MEETING — JUNE 18, 1993. The motion approved at the Summer Executive Board Meeting held on June 19, 1993 read as follows, "That as a result of the June 18 meeting with the officers of the Orthodox Church in America, that the Executive Board move forward in pursuing affiliation with the Orthodox Church in America." Thirty years later, it seems we're still chasing this recognition and attempting to work together. The OCA has its own pressing issues. The decline in FOCA members in the Northeast mirrors the decline in OCA membership in the same areas. Working with the FOCA — especially a much-shrunken FOCA since 1993 — is not a value proposition, in my opinion.

COLONIAL DISTRICT – (Cont'd)

With St. Mark, Chapter #229 and Nation's Capital, Chapter #79 both going inactive within the last twelve months, the Colonial District has been reduced to three active chapters: Trenton, St. Stephen's and Baltimore. While including Trenton in the Colonial District might have made sense in the past, the chapter members there wonder why their chapter isn't part of the New Jersey District (because the that's how the National By-Laws are written?). It should be up to this Convention body to make this decision. If, in fact, Trenton would become part of the New Jersey District, the members of St. Stephen's, Chapter #82, would also petition to join the New Jersey District. A District with two chapters barely constitutes a district.

The National Executive Board, to its credit, is trying to reactivate the St. Mark chapter. This may be wishful thinking. Exactly what does the FOCA have to offer to compel young adults to join? The Colonial District should not be held in limbo, waiting for St. Mark to decide whether it wants to have a chapter.

RECOMMENDATION

That the Trenton and St. Stephen's chapters be absorbed by the New Jersey District and that the Colonial District become inactive.

- provide educational, cultural, social and athletic activities for the people of our Orthodox Faith

The FOCA has, from its founding, served as an arm of the Orthodox Church here in North America. Throughout its history, the former FROC and now FOCA has responded to the most urgent of needs in our church. Looking at the last few years, it has become increasingly apparent that one of the most urgent needs in the OCA is that of serving our youth.

At the most recent FOCA convention, a report was given regarding the status of youth needs in the OCA. It was observed that there was a need to have organization to move forward for the youth in the United States of America. Rev. Fr. Daniel Ressetar, of blessed memory, stood at the microphone and stated, "we already have that. It is the FOCA."

Since that statement, under the leadership of our spiritual advisor, Fr. Nicholas Wyslutsky, the FOCA has sponsored virtual tours of numerous places and multiple youth retreats. Most recently, the FOCA has held virtual retreats serving youth from multiple jurisdictions far beyond the members of the organization. This is true to the intent of the FOCA in providing "for the people of our Orthodox Faith."

Planning committee for youth ages toddler to teen

Planning for high school ages

Planning for college ages

Planning for post-college to 35/40

Planning for middle-agers

Planning for 50 and above

Planning for focus on family
